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
NEL Evidence, Innovation, and Connections


Trauma Informed Care




Demystifying Self Harm (virtual 3 hour workshop)

This workshop will allow the space for participants to have open conversations about self-harm, including unpacking our own feelings and attitudes around self-harm (including thinking about our own faith, beliefs, life experience) and acknowledge them so that we are informed of how they may present and impact the support we provide.

Sarah is a Qualified Social Worker and has over 15 years' experience of working in the health and social care sector, including domestic abuse services, children centres, adoption and fostering teams and homelessness services. The UK is recognised worldwide as a leader in genomics and the unique structure of the NHS is allowing the delivery of genomic advances at scale and pace for patient benefit. As part of NHS England's (NHSE) strategy to establish a national Genomics Medicine Service (GMS), building on the success of the 100,000 Genomes Project, NHS England has commissioned seven genomic laboratory hubs (GLHs) each responsible for coordinating genomic and genetic testing services for a particular part of the country, including the start of whole genome sequencing.
