CPPE Newly Qualified Pharmacist Programme 2023-24

The Centre for Pharmacy Postgraduate Education (CPPE) and NHS England (NHSE) [Newly Qualified Pharmacist Programme](#) is now open for registration. Please see the information below from CPPE and the [website](#) for further information about the training offer provided and eligibility.

Key dates – Two Cohorts for 2023-24

Cohort 5: Applications are open and will close on 30 October 2023. The programme will begin on 6 November 2023

Cohort 6: Applications will open on 8th January 2024 and close on 18th March 2024 with a start date of 25th March 2024.

Note: NHS England WT&E provides separate funding for pharmacists working for Boots or in hospital pharmacy. These pharmacists are **not** eligible to apply for the CPPE programme. The regional launch for Newly Qualified Pharmacist Pathway for hospital pharmacists will be mid-Sept 2023 and will be shared to organisation education leads.

A Safe Surgery can be any GP practice which commits to taking steps to ensure that their services are available to everyone in their community.

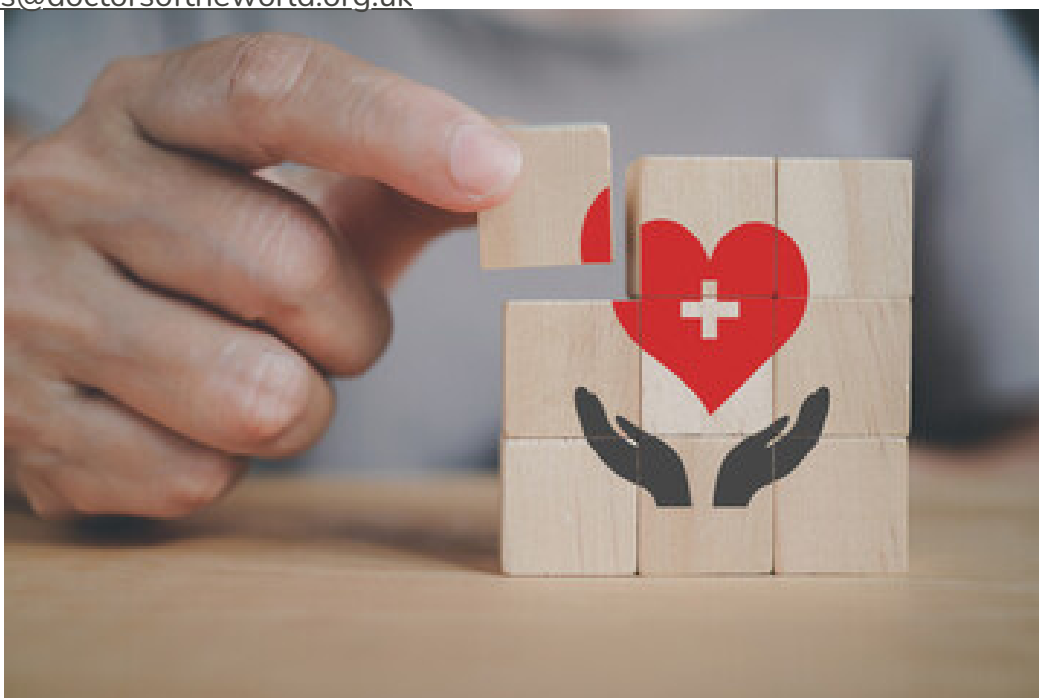
Why become a Safe Surgery?

GPN Survey on ARRS Workforce Impact

The QNI has opened a new online survey on the impact of the ARRS (Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme) on the **General Practice Nursing Workforce**. The survey is for Registered Nurses working in General Practice, in England only.

The ARRS has been implemented by NHS England to support the introduction of new roles into General Practice, for example physician associates and pharmacists.

They have created the survey to gauge the impact of the ARRS on the General Practice Nursing workforce (RNs working in general practice). The survey has 21 questions and should take around 10 minutes to complete. It contains no identifying information.

Using NHS Estates in Creative Ways
