Becoming a Designated Prescribing Practitioner (DPP)

The Primary Care Team within NHS England's Workforce Training and Education Directorate are delighted to announce a new multi – professional pilot course to help non-medical prescribers (NMP) become Designated Prescribing Practitioners (DPPs) allowing them to help supervise fellow colleagues.

The course consists of five online sessions running for 1 hour 30 minutes held over a two-month period. You will be required to attend all five sessions to fulfil completion of the course. Please when registering to attend the course, please select only one option on the session dates as there are three options per session.

There will be 2 phases of this pilot, you will only be required to attend 1 phase for completion.

If you wish to apply, please complete the application form which can be accessed from the link/QR code on the attached flyer. Please note there is only 22 places available on this course.

Please note that this course is NOT equivalent to the Multi – professional educator course. Please see the reasons to why the course is different:

- This Multi professional pilot course to: Becoming a Designated Prescribing Practitioner (DPP) in Primary Care is develop the skills to supervise a specific activity i.e., prescribing for non-medical prescribers, and stands alone to achieve that goal.
- It has a different purpose to the multi professional educator course which is to develop skills to become a clinical or educational supervisor of a professional on a training course placed in primary care

GPN Return to Practice Programme 2023-24

Are you interested in returning to nursing? If so, why not enrol onto a Return to Practice (RTP) Programme! The RTP course is for nurses whose NMC registration has lapsed and are unable to meet the NMC revalidation requirements.

NHS England (formerly HEE London) is offering up to £3000 to GP practices for providing placements to returning nurses and for recruiting nurses via this route. The 2023-24 offer is for GP practices in the London region.

The programme is combined of taught days at a university, whilst being on placement at a GP practice. You do not need to have experience of working as a General Practice Nurse to apply for the programme which is open to all previously registered nurses with relevant experience in any field of nursing.
