

NHS Primary Care entry level employability programme

As part of a project to enable underrepresented groups to access health care careers, NEL Training Hub have developed an employability programme and are keen to work with Primary Care employers.

The programme consists of a one week classroom training followed by a two week placement in a Primary Care environment. The face to face training modules will cover key competencies befitting a front reception and administrative role including **customer care** and **communication skills**, **telephone** handling, conflict resolution, medical terminology and more.

Currently looking for employers to host the two weeks placements. Practices will be offered a £300 grant to support with supervision backfill.

Placements are expected to develop experience and understanding in the following areas:

- Meeting & Greeting visitors
- Receiving telephone calls
- Supporting back office admin functions Booking patients in for appointments
- Using EMIS and other clinical systems

Healthcare Science Assistant and Healthcare Science Associate - revised standards published:

The revised apprenticeship standards for the Level 2 Healthcare Science Assistant and Level 4 Healthcare Science Associate have been published by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education (IfATE). The revised versions of these apprenticeships have been agreed and are available for information only at present. They will replace the current version for new starts once the funding band is agreed and after the notice period.

Physiological Science Apprenticeship Funding EOI: London:

For a limited time, the NHS England London Workforce, Training and Education Healthcare Science team is inviting expressions of interest for Physiological Science only Healthcare Science Apprenticeship Training Grants for 2023/24.

Priority will be given to the following areas:

- Cardio-respiratory Assistants and Associates (Level 2 and Level 4 apprenticeships)
- Sleep Disorder Assistants and Associates (Level 2 and level 4 apprenticeships)

There is funding available for a maximum of 9 apprentices in Physiological Science for services in London. The funding will be £10,400 and paid pro-rata to organisations. It is only for apprentices starting on programme before 31st March 2024. To apply please complete the expression of interest found here
