Prescribing of Benzodiazepines & Z-drugs

BHR CEPN & Waltham Forest Training Hub would like to invite you to attend an important one-hour webinar "Prescribing of Benzodiazepines & Z-drugs" on 11th January from 12-1pm. We will have Priyanka Naik (CMHT Pharmacist for Redbridge), Ishraq Chowdhury (CMHT Pharmacist for Havering) as guest speakers.

This session will provide critical insights for PCN Pharmacists, Clinical Pharmacists, and Practice-based Pharmacists on:

- Principles of safe benzodiazepine prescribing and reasons to avoid long-term use due to dependency risks
- How to manage any problems during weaning off
- Tools and protocols for successfully managing withdrawal and addressing patient concerns
- A case study discussion to reinforce learning

The session should make you reflect on any changes in practice required to promote safe prescribing and offer withdrawal to patients.

The learning outcomes;

- You will understand the risks of dependency for these class of drugs,
- How to prescribe safely & review where clinically indicated,
- How to deprescribe in patients who agree to withdrawal following review,
- How to manage withdrawal symptoms.
- Understanding of the principles by discussion of a case study.

This webinar provides practical knowledge to promote benzodiazepine prescribing and support patients through evidence-based withdrawal programs. Attending will enable you to positively impact prescribing practices at your own setting.

Carers provide unpaid care and support to family and friends to carry out day to day activities. Care and support can include personal care, administering medication, shopping and paying bills. Carers experience a lot of pressure in relation to their caring role and this fund will help develop the market offer to carers which can be accessed in the long term through their personal budgets.

Carers of Barking and Dagenham in partnership with London Borough of Barking and Dagenham would like to invite organisations to bid for funding through the innovation fund to deliver innovative solutions in carer service provision. We would like to invite providers to an event on Friday 12 January at 11:00am to hear details of the innovation fund which will be launched in January 2024 with a view for submissions to be returned on Monday 19 February 2024.

Successful bidders will present their bids to a panel on Thursday 29 February.

Lot 1: Provision for bespoke psychological support service to the value of £16,000 that will include the provision of psychological support, for example 4 weeks 1:1 targeted support and therapeutic group work. This is based on carers feedback.

Lot 2: This is an exciting opportunity for you to provide solutions to meet our carers needs. Bids in this lot should not exceed £11,000.



Carers Charter 2022-25

This Carers Charter has been developed with unpaid carers in Barking and Dagenham who provide valuable support to loved ones. The charter outlines the commitment to carers across the borough including our partners and how we will help them in their caring role.



Working together for carers

- 1. I have help at an early stage.
- I want friendly professionals who understand my role as a carer and listen to me.
- I am recognised as an expert and equal partner of care with my views and opinions valued and respected.
- 4. I want to access a range of support, including breaks from my caring responsibilities, to help me live my life and continue to carry on with my caring role.



Carers wellbeing and employment

- I have access to information and advice to help me look after my own mental and physical health.
- I can access an effective response from health and social care to address changes in my loved ones needs, for instance increase in care package so that I can return to work quickly.
- I am supported to maximise my income including accessing benefits.
- I am supported with my caring responsibilities so that I can continue to work or study.



Supporting young carers

- I can attend carers support groups and activities with young carers that understand what I am going through.
- I can access help to support me with my mental health and wellbeing.
- I am able to focus on my future and my studies without impacting on my caring role, including university, training, apprenticeships and employment options.
- My school or college understands my caring role and I feel supported.



Carers in the wider community

- I recognise I may need help both in my caring role and in maintaining my own health and well-being.
- I can access a carers needs assessment when I need it.
- I want to be able to find out information about what services are available in the community.
- Information is shared with me and other professionals to raise awareness and signposted appropriately.

From a patient perspective: Improving the experience of Annual Health Checks for patients with a Learning Disability

Join our Workshop which uses 'Forum Theatre' techniques to explore how the Annual Health Check feels from the viewpoint of patients with a Learning Disability (LD), and supports collaborative development of ways to improve the patient experience and outcomes.

This is a rare opportunity to participate in action learning and co-development, with workshops led by People First, a LD-led organisation that uses Forum Theatre to support interactive discussion with patients on how to improve specific activities and practices.

Who should attend?

- Any primary care staff involved in Annual Health Checks for patients with a Learning Disability should attend.
 This includes all clinical staff: GPs, Pharmacists, Nurses, Healthcare Assistants. Also non-clinical staff: Care Coordinators, Social Prescribing Link Workers, Practice Managers and Reception and Admin staff.
- Participants will be joined by patients with a Learning Disability who want to share their experience and explore how to improve the process with health professionals.

There is no limit on how many staff come from your team. Places will be booked on a first come first served basis

Aim of the workshop

Workshops will support the existing QI project for Annual Health Checks for patients with a learning disability with the overall aim of improving the outcomes of the Annual Health Check, including medication review, action planning and follow up and ultimately improve patient attendance. Focus so far has been on delivery systems. These workshops will support QI by generating understanding of the patient experience and putting things in place to make this as meaningful and empowering as possible.
