Annual Health Checks (AHCs) for patients with learning disabilities (PWLD) proactively identify and address health concerns. However, our audit revealed quality inconsistencies that need improvement.

Our training aims to enhance AHCs outcomes using a structured medication review template and offering targeted webinars and training sessions to upskill primary care clinicians.

This training, funded by BHR CEPN for one person from each PCN, ensures clinicians can conduct comprehensive, efficient reviews that benefit patients and improve annual attendance. Staff will complete the online webinar and work with our AHC clinical lead to develop a specific training programme.

Fellowship Opportunity: NEL Personalised Care Fellow We're seeking a motivated individual for a part-time fellowship as the NEL Personalised Care Fellow. This role is open to candidates from any clinical or non-clinical background, including care coordinators, health and wellbeing coaches, or social prescribing link workers.

The fellowship requires a commitment of two sessions per week for 24 months, offering approximately £12,000 per annum (£24,000 total).

The Fellow will work closely with the NEL Personalised Care Clinical Lead, with managerial support from the NEL Training Hub and Personalised Care Programme Managers. The role may be remote, depending on circumstances. The primary focus will be strengthening and embedding the Personalised Care Agenda in primary care and PCNs across NEL.

The successful applicant will increase knowledge, skills, and confidence in implementing the Universal Care Model in primary care, conduct a training needs analysis, deliver and support training for key priorities, and more.

Nationally, 61% of adults struggle to understand health information that contains both words and numbers. In some areas of North East London, the figure is nearly 80%. This has huge implications for individuals and for our Integrated Care System.

Motivational Interviewing Training

The course includes:

- Identifying readiness for change or vaccination
- Sharing information supportively
- Collaborative planning


