Becoming a Designated Prescribing Practitioner

The Primary Care Team within NHS England's Workforce Training and Education Directorate are delighted to announce a new multi – professional pilot course to help non-medical prescribers (NMP) become Designated Prescribing Practitioners (DPPs) allowing them to help supervise fellow colleagues.

Course dates: The course would consist of 5 online sessions each running 1 hour 30 minutes running over a 2-month period: Please only select one option from the 5 sessions.

For Phase 1 the registration closes on the **18th September 2023**.

Eligibility Criteria: This course is for multi-professional non – medical prescribers (NMP) working in primary care. They should be active prescribers and be prescribing for at least 2 years prior to carrying out this pilot course, with the desire to train and become a DPP for future NMP trainees.



Reducing pressure & improving patient outcomes

This webinar will support colleagues in primary care to understand how to implement personalised proactive care, using a targeted approach to reduce reliance on clinical input through improved biopsychosocial support. It will explain how to make best use of the skills and expertise of social prescribing link workers, health and wellbeing coaches and care co-ordinators to tackle population health needs. The webinar will also provide an opportunity to remind PCNs of the proactive social prescribing service set out in the network contact DES, and that they can recruit social prescribing link workers, health and wellbeing coaches and care co-ordinators through the ARRS.
