


Becoming An Anti-Racist Health & Care System

Tower Hamlets Together as our local health and care partnership are keen to support local organisations proactively challenge racism and build an inclusive culture. In order to achieve this, we are keen on supporting organisations address inappropriate or racist behaviour and outdated attitudes, and develop an understanding of concepts like privilege and allyship.

By attending this introductory workshop, staff would have:

- explored their understanding of racism, its root causes and how racism is maintained
- understood how racism shows up (covert and overt) and it impact on health inequalities
- explored what it means to be anti -racist and how it differs from business as usual
- reflected on what it means to develop an anti-racist approach in their work - including what support they may need going forward

Hidden Carers Training

Training Workshops Identifying and referring 'hidden' carers

The London Borough of Barking and Dagenham in partnership with Carers of Barking and Dagenham invite partners across the Council, Health, Community and Voluntary Sector to attend **free training** to help identify 'hidden' carers and understand how to support and refer them to the Carers' Hub.

Around 14,224 people identify themselves as carers in Barking and Dagenham, however only 4,500 are known to services. These 'hidden' Carers also known as informal or unpaid carers who often don't have any help or support.

By identifying carers and referring them to the Carers' Hub these **carers can access timely information, advice and support.**



The National Guardian Office provides universal freedom to speak up training which primary care guardians should complete. 'Speak Up, Listen Up, Follow Up' is divided into three modules.
